On the people's life at Tokyo after the 1923 Great Kanto Earthquake described in a diary by Tatsuzo Kajima

Tatsuzo Kajima, who was a vise-president of Kajima Corporation, lived at Tabata in Tokyo, when the 1923 Great Kanto Earthquake occurred. He left a diary, named Tensai Nikki between Sept.1st to 8th. This is useful to know the relief for the damaged people, restoration to the normal life, and influence of the false rumors under the martial law in Tokyo after the earthquake. A book including the article of this diary and the explanation for its contents was published in the last year. This presentation is performed based on this book.
